The fort was built to garrison the troops sent to subdue the native Seminole Indians who were not best pleased with the settlers moving onto their lands.

The city of Fort Myers grew up around the fort and flourished as a cattle station, port and rail terminal long after the fort itself was decommissioned.

The downtown regeneration and cultural renaissance of Fort Myers, in recent years has been startling. And equally as remarkable is the infusion of artistic and cultural activities and initiatives from the citizens.

It all makes Fort Myers a very rewarding city break in its own right as well as a base to tour the areas beaches.

The Beaches of Fort Myers

Fort Myers Beach is located along a thin strip of barrier island on the Gulf of Mexico, in South West Florida.

It is a real tourist trap, attracting those families and young people searching for sun, sea, sand and the 'Coney Island' style excitement of the Times Square dining and entertainment district.

And even while the focus is invariably on the fun side of a sunshine holiday, those looking for something a little more exclusive can take the short drive to Lovers Key state park, where a tractor-pulled tram runs through a mangrove forest to one of Florida's most pristine stretches of sand.

Alternatively a short trip over the causeway and one is on the barrier islands of Sanibel and Captiva or, for a cultural experience, head to downtown Fort Myers, which has enjoyed a remarkable artistic renaissance in recent years.

I pack my clothes and other items in the zippered plastic bags that sheets come in - one bag for each type of item. They keep everything so neat and wrinkle-free it is amazing! And you can easily see through them to know exactly what is inside.

Kimbel Westerson says :

I pack underwear/bras that dry quickly, no padded t-shirt bras. I don't hesitate to donate things that have proved superfluous along the way. Bring spare converter plugs.

Wendy Liscia says:

Maybe travellers would like to link to a charity I follow www.stuffyourrucksack.com/index.php They ask that if you have any room in your luggage take some things along that will benefit local charities. It's much more rewarding than taking another pair of shoes.

Matt Morris says :

Ciprofloxacin. It's the best antibiotic for wiping out nasty stomach illnesses that your immune system takes ages to shift. I wish I'd had some in El Nido last year. Shigella ruined my holiday.

Kerry McKinnon Hansen says :

Yes, Cipro is a must! When packing, I stick to a general colour scheme when choosing clothes; that way I can mix and match things more easily. It also allows you to pack less jewelry and fewer shoes.

One item I'm always sure to pack is a big sarong - it has so many uses: a blanket for chilly flights, beach cover-up, picnic blanket, wrap around fragile items in luggage, hang it over an uncurtained window for added privacy, wrap it around a bed pillow if you're unsure of the pillowcase. It's come in handy for me many times.

Kate Nivison says :

Dental floss in a tiny dispenser with a clipper to cut it. Because you'll never break it otherwise. Great for an emergency washing line, parcel string, holding up trousers, securing broken bag zips, dodgy door locks and windows, and bags to seat or bunk.

But always remember you will have to cut it at some point, and even your nicely flossed teeth may not do the trick.
