
# The Downtown dining experience



An essential ingredient of life in Naples is the fine dining it offers.

Leave the Inn on Fifth and there are 32 restaurants, within a strolling distance along 5th Avenue and 3rd Street - and not a bad one among them.

And that does not include the ice cream parlours, and you will want to include an ice cream parlour.



Together they bring the world's cuisine to Downtown Naples and, this being Florida, there is the choice of dining inside or alfresco to suit the mood and the weather.

Fish and stone crab is a particular favourite



Several of the restaurants have live music and most offer very tempting happy hours.

# No road rage here



The other thing about Downtown Naples are the drivers. They meander along Fifth willingly stopping to wave one across the road whenever and wherever the need arises.

It's a courtesy that surprises at first, but is typical of the friendly, slow paced nature of Naples.



But for slow paced, do not read sleepy. There is an underlying vibrancy about this place particularly during the evening, when the bars and restaurants come alive.

And, of course, there is also the beach at the southern end of Fifth.

The avenue comes to an end with a barrier trees and shrubs, through which there is a small wooden walkway.

#### A glorious expanse

This leads onto a panoramic expanse of glorious sand and still blue water.

Knowing this stretch of the Gulf Coast, I walk along the beach to my right and one of my favourite spots anywhere.



It's a one time fishing jetty, but all that remains are the wooden stanchions that stick up and stretch out some way into the water.



These provide ideal resting spots for dozens of pelicans and other sea birds. And provides me with yet another chance to relax and unwind in Naples.

#### **McCabes**



McCabes is an Irish pub restaurant and, while these are to be found worldwide, this is as authentic as you will find outside of the Emerald Isle.

Phil McCabe, the owner of the Inn on Fifth, is second generation Irish and not known for doing things by half.

So when he decided to establish an Irish pub on Fifth Avenue he found one in Dublin, shipped it, 'lock, stock and barrel' to Naples, and also brought over Irish craftsmen to reassemble the pub on the ground floor of the Inn on Fifth.

McCabes serves good pub fare, beers and wine and has nightly live Irish entertainment for the real 'craic'.

#### **Trulucks**



Trulucks, which is located next to Mcabes, could not be further from it in terms of style and ambience.


This is a casually sophisticated, cosmopolitan seafood, steak and crabhouse restaurant although first stop has be to the piano bar, particularly during happy hour.

This is where the locals hang out, and where you can enjoy Margarita's that are worth the flight to Florida.

A Trulucks highlight is the stone crabs, when in season (15 October to 14 May). The restaurant has its own sustainable, stone crab fishery on the Isle of Capri some 18 miles away.
